Returning to again impress over tracks built by USA's Nick Granat and Steve Stephens, the up-andcoming members of the allfemale U.S. team—Anthony (34), Jacobs (30) and Dean (25)—kept the team on five faults after a rail from Dean and time fault from Jacobs. In the end, the effort was enough to seal the victory and prevent anchor rider Kraut from needing to return in the second round.

"Very rarely does the anchor rider on any winning team get to sit it out," said Chef d'Equipe Robert Ridland, who recently announced he will continue in the role through 2028. Finishing on a total of 12, Ireland took second and Belgium third with 17 faults. Making her senior team debut, Anthony posted the only double-clear of the day for the U.S. and gave all credit to her 2012 Dutch Warmblood gelding (Calvaro

"We wouldn't be here without the horses, so I definitely owe everything to Heavenly and to my team that supports me every day to be able to achieve this incredible opportunity and goal," she said.

Dean used the experience of Acota M, a 2013 Oldenburg mare (Toulon x Quattro 7), to start the team off right on a clear. "She's a super special horse for me. I've had her for four years now, and I've jumped all over the world with her. She's just an incredible athlete. To me, she's a pony but she jumps the biggest classes in the world and I'm thrilled to win this one."

For Jacobs, the win is a step towards big things to come. "I would love to jump for another Nations Cup or two this year. I think my horse is really good with this format. I thought he actually got better in the second round," she said of Playboy JT Z, a 2015 Zangersheide gelding (Presley Boy x Plot Blue). "Hopefully there's a few opportunities for me over the summer. He's still only ten so these are still stepping stones that can build him up to some day jumping some of the biggest Nations

Cups in the world." In her ninetieth Nations Cup appearance for the U.S., Kraut was mounted on a still inexperienced Tres Bien Z—2015 Zangersheide gelding (Toulon x Nabab de Reve).

"This was the nicest anchoring I've ever had to do," she joked. "From the beginning when Robert told me who the team was, I was really pumped. These three amazing riders have been on fire for a while now, not just recently but for years. The way they rode the first round, it was textbook. I think building towards the Los Angeles Olympics we have three exciting young girls here that I think have a strong chance if things go right. For the win, Ridland

accepted the Denis Quinlan Perpetual Trophy from Jenny Quinlan.

## ARTURO PARADA VALLEJO Brings a Win Home for Mexico

exico ended Nations Cup week in winning fashion at Wellington International with Arturo Parada Vallejo topping the \$200,000 CSIO4\* Grand Prix, presented by JTWG, Inc., aboard Fellow van't Moerven.

Parada and David Bustillos' 15-year-old Dutch Warmblood gelding (VDL Zirocco Blue x Farmer) were the sole double-clear effort over Nick Granat and Steve Stephens' (USA) courses. One of four to jump clear over the first track, Parada showed that a clear round was attainable, but he didn't leave anything to chance come jump-off time.

"My plan is always the same: go as fast as I can," Parada joked, especially considering he was second of four to jump, so he wasn't sure how much it would take to win. "Since I know [Fellow] is a big horse with a big stride, I tried to do one less in every line."

Both final riders were indeed faster, but each one brought one rail down, finishing on fast 4-fault scores. Mark Bluman (COL) captured the secondplace position aboard S&L Maracana', owned by S & L Farms, and Charlie Jones (GBR) was third with Capitale 6, owned by Morning Star Sporthorses.

It was luck that brought Fellow van't Moerven into Parada's string. Based in Guadalajara, Mexico, Parada works closely with Bustillos in California, splitting his time between top shows in his home country and top shows in the United States.

"This horse came through [Bustillos' program] and I thought, 'Yeah I'll ride it,'" he shared. "It came out of nowhere and it was with an amateur rider. She sent the horse to [Bustillos] and we

> figured we'd try it." There were two reasons the horse stood out: "A: he was available," Parada continued.

"B: it has a lot of strength, it's really brave, and really straightforward. I like those kinds of horses."

The pieces fell into place quickly, and a win at the four-star level proves this pair—only matched together last fall—do suit one another. "[The horse] responds well every time a question is asked," he went on about the horse's way of going. "We understood each other really quickly and even though he's not the fastest horse, he's responding well to one stride less or a quick turn.

"Winning any grand prix is nice, but this is especially nice but this is great because it's a top start list of riders," continued Parada. "The course was not built to be an easy win, and giving a win to Mexico outside of Mexico is always really special so I'm really emotional."

Parada's grooms, Edgar Ramiro Minero and Gerson Ramos, were presented with the \$500 Double H Farm Grooms Award after the win in recognition of their care of Fellow van't Moerven.

## TIM BRENNAN Takes BrainJuice U25 Semi-Final Grand Prix for Ireland

Inder the lights of the International Arena, the \$32,000 BrainJuice U25 Semi-Final Grand Prix—the penultimate competition of the series—was won by Ireland's Tim Brennan.

The track, designed by USA's Steve Stephens and Nicholas Granat, proved difficult with only six returning for the jump-off. Out of the returning six, two cleared the short track but it was Ireland's Tim Brennan that took the title aboard his own Diadema Della Caccia (Diamant de Semilly x Cardento 933).

"She's deadly careful, she's got the heart of a lion; he will jump anything for you once you ask her and I just have to be on the ball," said Brennan of the 10-year-old Italian Sporthorse mare. "I've been very lucky to have her for five years now. She's taken me all the way up through the ranks in Ireland and now we're lucky enough to bring her out here."

After winning at Youth Nations Cups with the mare in Germany and Italy over the summer, Brennan is making the most out of his first season in Wellington, something the nineteenyear-old has had his sights on for several seasons.

"I was always thinking about coming out here; it's a great experience to get more mileage under my belt," said Brennan, who hails from Kilkenny and was cheered on ringside by his family visiting from Ireland. "I'm looking forward to carrying this experience home—hopefully for a good year."

Riding with fellow Irishman John Roche while stateside, Brennan continued. "He has a good eye, good feel and a strong bond with that mare," said Roche. "A good grey mare they try for you. They're great and he gets on very well with her. "This series brings great development," said Roche, who gave credit to the whole team at JR Show Stables, especially Brennan's groom Juan Luis "Guicho" Rebollo. "For juniors or amateurs, it gives great opportunities for team involvement, and there's no one route to success. I can't say enough positive things about the division."

## DENISE MORIARTY Loves Watching Kent Farrington's Horses Grow

enise Moriarty grew up in County Mayo, Ireland. Her foray into the horse world started after her mother sent her to a riding school in her early teens. She has worked as head groom for Kent Farrington for 14 years and was on hand as he took home the Lugano Grand Prix CSI5\* with Greya—the team's second consecutive five-star victory this season.

#### What led to your job working with Kent Farrington?

When I finished college, I came to the States to work for Marilyn and Lynne Little at Raylyn Farm. Kent used to show horses for them, so that is how I met him. After working for eight months for Ronan McGuigan, I went to work for Kent, and I've been with him ever since

#### How would you describe Greya's personality?

She's a very feisty mare, and she's very opinionated. Thankfully, she uses that fight for the good in the ring and she's a very determined mare. In the stall, she greets you with her ears pulled back—even if you have a carrot. It's just her way.

#### How did you prepare Greya for the Lugano Grand Prix?

We keep the routine pretty simple. We feed in the morning, hand walk and then we normally run the blanket in the morning one time. We'll have a walk again at lunchtime, and then Kent normally rides her around 4. She'll have a small snack for dinner, and then we leave her alone before we come back and get her ready for the class. When she sees the lights from the stands, she starts to march to the ring because she knows where she's going.

#### What do you love most about your job?

Watching the horses grow. We have had Greya for many years, so it's exciting to see her step up and do the big stuff now and do it well. She's been on form now for the last two years. She's figured it out. She took a little bit longer than some of the others, but she has a lot of quality, so she was worth the wait.

### What advice would you give to someone wanting to work as a groom at the top level of the sport?

You have to love the horses and love what you do. The horses come first, and it's not just a simple 9 to 5 job. It consumes a lot of time to reap the rewards of the success in the ring. Love the horses and observe other people so you're always learning.
