To Our Valued Equestrian Community,

As I lead the incredible management team that was already in place, my priority going forward is clear:

To Keep Wellington International the Premier Horse Sports Destination in the World for Generations to Come!

To that end, we are embarking on a multi-year journey where we will be investing to upgrade the existing facilities, building out new state-of-the-art facilities on newly acquired adjacent land that will double the size of our showgrounds, and we will be bringing you many new programs and services designed to deliver you an unparalleled experience. Let me assure you that while we go through this journey, horse and rider safety will always come first.

While we are only just beginning, significant progress has already been made in several key areas:

- **Extended Equitan Surfaces:** The comfort and safety of our equine athletes, their grooms, and riders are of the utmost importance. We have extended the Equitan bridle path surfaces, enhancing the quality and support provided throughout our venue. This includes the FEI path from the maintenance area past Ring 10. This extension will also improve stormwater drainage.
- **New LED Lights in the International Arena:** We are thrilled to introduce newly installed, state-of-the-art lighting in the International Arena. This upgrade ensures optimal visibility during evening events, enhancing the safety for horse and rider as well as the spectator experience.
- **New Jumbotron in the International Arena:** We are excited to have been able to obtain and install a new state-of-the-art Jumbotron with significantly broadened technical capabilities in the International Arena that will also provide an enhanced viewing experience.

- **New Open Flatting/Lunging Rings:** We will immediately feel an initial benefit to the larger showground footprint with the addition of new open flatting/lunging rings on Parcel F, which will be completed in time for Circuit. This not only benefits those stabling on the grounds, but it also helps reduce congestion in the main competition warm up areas.
- **Enhanced Maintenance & Cleaning:** For this season, we have contracted additional cleaning staff. With these additional resources, we will be conducting maintenance and cleaning on the showgrounds during day and night. We would appreciate your help keeping our venue clean. To aid in this, we will be adding additional trash receptacles throughout the property.
- **Golf Cart Shuttle Routes Sponsored by WeatherTech:** We understand that parking can be a challenge at the showgrounds. To ease access across the venue, we have enhanced golf cart shuttle routes, providing a seamless way to navigate the grounds. We have also added off-site employee parking to make sure every spot in close proximity of the stabling areas goes to our valued customers.
- **Exciting Hospitality Venue Updates:** We are delighted to introduce the NetJets Landing, an exceptional hospitality space crafted to enhance your experience at Wellington International. This luxurious venue offers breathtaking views and top-notch amenities, creating a perfect retreat for equestrian enthusiasts on Saturday evenings. 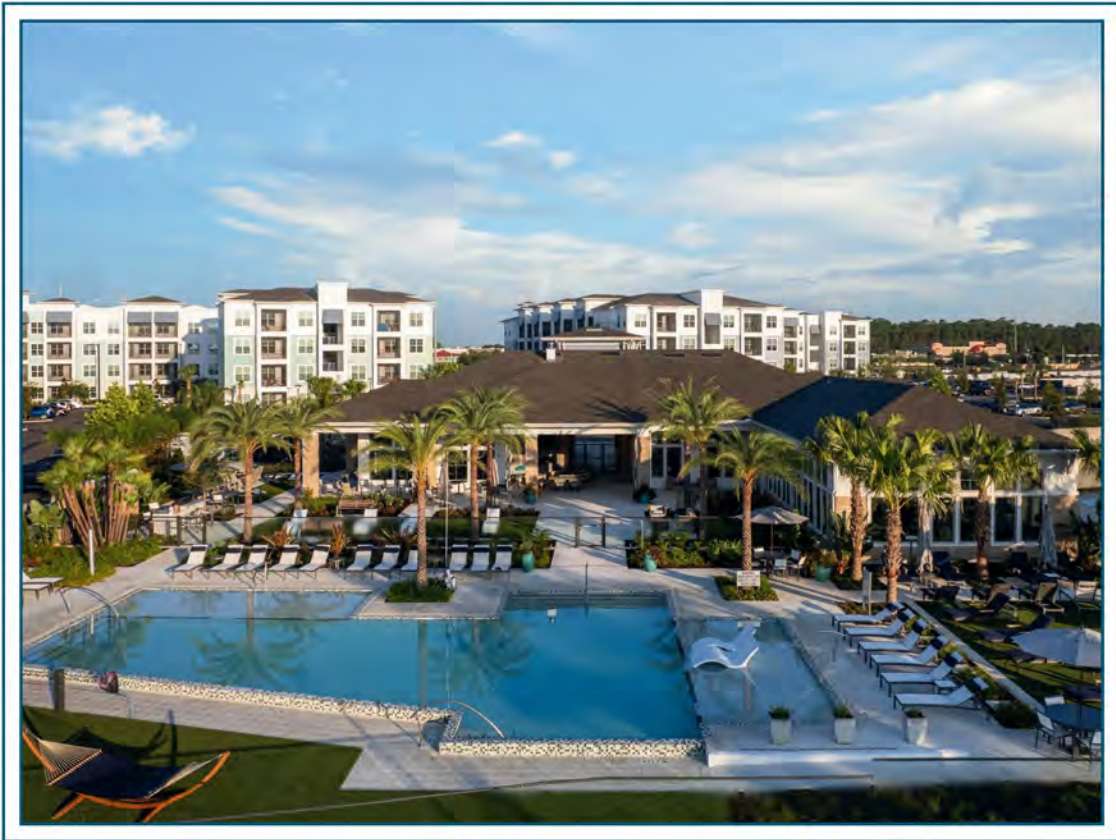

As the grand finale of WEF 2025, the Rolex US Equestrian Open Grand Prix stands as one of the most prestigious show jumping events in the U.S. and marks the final – and only U.S. – stop in the inaugural Rolex Series. With \$750,000 in prize money on the line, this event attracts the best riders from around the world, competing at the highest level. The grand prix will serve as the culmination of 13 weeks of intense competition, ensuring a dramatic and thrilling conclusion to the competition season.

Victory at Wellington International's Rolex Grand Prix

Just months after his triumph in Wellington, Kukuk's journey reached its pinnacle at the 2024 Paris Olympics. Facing immense pressure on the world's grandest stage, Kukuk and Checker 47 once again proved unbeatable. Their electrifying rounds led the German rider to capture individual gold, earning him the highest honor in equestrian sports.

Kukuk's Olympic performance was marked by a level of consistency that has become synonymous with his riding style. 3 Facts Veterinarians Wish You Knew about DJD

Get a better understanding of degenerative joint disease (DJD) and how you and your veterinarian can work together to help manage the disease in your horse.

The qualifiers will be held in Intermediate II and the final in Grand Prix for Young Horses. With \$15,000 in total prize money and no entry fees, Lövsta continues to support the riders and teams around them.

Jumping into 2025: Lövsta Future Challenge vision for future show jumping stars

The Lövsta Future Challenge Jumping tour provides seven-year-old horses the chance to gain invaluable experience in a competitive environment. This upcoming season, the tour will host seven qualifiers throughout the Winter Equestrian Festival circuit, culminating in a grand finale at Wellington International with \$25,000 in prize money.

Reflecting on last year's season, Sophie Mörner, founder of Lövsta Future Challenge Jumping US, says, "We were thrilled about the outcome of last year's season. With over 200 entries from more than 15 nationalities,

we saw how crucial it is to put future stars into the spotlight. By giving them the opportunity to compete at Wellington International, we hope to equip them with the experience they need for a successful future."

Honoring Horsemanship and Giving Back to the Community

Beyond competitive success, Lövsta Future Challenge remains deeply committed to sustainability, horsemanship, and community. One example of this commitment is the ongoing collaboration with Vinceremos Therapeutic Riding Center, a facility that among other things provides equine-assisted therapy for people with disabilities. For the 2025 season, Lövsta Future Challenge will donate \$100 for each participant in its U.S. events to Vinceremos, helping to support its life-changing programs for people of all ages.

"It's equally important for us to look beyond the arena to places where these incredible animals bring joy, healing, and hope in ways that far surpass medals or trophies," Johnson concludes.

A SILVER CELEBRATION

for the U.S. Olympic Jumping Team in Paris

With the stunning backdrop of the Palace of Versailles and surrounded by the historic gardens, the equestrian events at the 2024 Paris Olympics produced countless iconic scenes. For Team USA, the sweetest sight of the Games may have been the USA Jumping Team's ascent to the podium.

American jumping has had plenty to be proud of over its Olympic history, including team silver medals at the two previous Games, Rio de Janeiro in 2016 and in Tokyo in 2021. The program's formula for success continued through Paris as the team completed their silver-medal hat trick.

The team of Olympic veterans Kent Farrington, Laura Kraut, and McLain Ward with debutant Karl Cook named as alternate proved to be a winning formula under the current Olympic format, which does not leave room for a drop score. When Farrington's mount, Greya, displayed minor health concerns related to allergies, Cook and Caracole de la Roque (Zandor Z x Pocahontas d'Amaury), the 2012 Selle Français mare owned by

Signe Ostby and cared for by Tessa Falanga, stepped in to the spotlight. (Farrington (Wellington, FL) and Greya (Colestus x Contessa), Kent Farrington LLC's 2014 Oldenburg mare, have since gone on to compete in top form stateside, including a win in the Longines FEI Jumping World Cup Qualifier at Traverse City in September 2024.)

"We had a strong one in Rio, and this [team] was stronger, and a stronger [team] than we had in Tokyo," said Chef d'Equipe Robert Ridland after the team's silver medal win in Paris. "We have three of the greatest riders that have ever ridden for our country on this team—Kent, Laura, and McLain—and then we brought [Karl]. What that is, is the present and the future."

Cook (Rancho Santa Fe, Calif.) and Caracole de la Roque ultimately proved they were prepared, turning in double-clear rounds in the Team Qualifier and Final.

"It's what we were mentally preparing for," said Cook after the Team Qualifier. "When we got called up, we knew it could

be close to the start. What we decided was the right strategy was to prepare like we were jumping. Even if we weren't, you had to prepare yesterday, last night, this morning. I came with blue pants on, but I packed everything as if I was showing. Mentally, I was showing."

Ridland had high praise for Cook, who stepped up and performed under challenging conditions.

"That is one of the hardest things to do, to get a last-minute, two hours before the event [call] and say, 'Oh, can you bring your white breeches? You're on,'" said Ridland. "Hats off to Karl, truly. And of course, we're very proud of our other combinations, too. It just really came together for us today, and these guys delivered when it mattered most."

Laura Kraut (Royal Palm Beach, FL) brought not only her own wealth of experience to Paris, which marked her fourth Olympic team, but also had the team's only repeat equine Olympian, Baloutinue (Balou du Rouet x Utika), St. Bride's Farm's 2010 Hanoverian gelding, cared for by Margo Thomas. The



pair served as the team's pathfinders on day one of jumping competition and set the tone with a double-clear first round.

"My last Olympics with him, I'd been riding him for only a few months, so I hardly knew him at all. We hardly knew what he liked to eat," Kraut recalled. "So, it was really comforting to come here, this time knowing the horse, and I feel like both of us have formed a partnership. And I think he trusts me, and I certainly trust him. I felt completely confident that he could go in there and do it today."

Although an uncharacteristic rail down in the triple combination

added four faults to Kraut's scores during the team final, their fast and otherwise expertly executed round helped to instill confidence in the team during the high-pressure final day of team competition.

After securing team silver, Kraut and "Boo" went on to have the best individual result for Team USA, finishing in eighth place over the huge course designed by Gregory Bodo (FRA) and Santiago Varela (ESP).

With five Olympic games under his belt, McLain Ward (Brewster, NY) entered his sixth with both the experience and the pressure that comes with

being one of the world's most accomplished athletes in the sport. Riding Ilex (Baltic VDL x Calendula), the 2013 KWPN gelding, owned by Bonne Chance Farm and Ward, cared for by Virginie Casterman, the pair were impressive, and rode strategically as the team's anchor, preserving the team's medal chances in the Team Qualifier despite an unlucky rail.

"I was thrilled. I knew going in that we had a big margin of error, so I planned to just be a little conservative and make sure there wasn't a big blow-up," said Ward following the qualifier. "It was a very light rub, but not a big deal."

Ward's steady skill and confidence ultimately helped secure the silver medal during the team final, where they were tasked with securing Team USA's place on the podium. Under the current Olympic format, there is a 20-minute break between the second and final rotation, and the order of go is adjusted for that final round based on standings from the first two rotations.

"This format is a real pressure cooker. The first time we did this in Tokyo, I looked over at arguably ten of the best riders in the world, and they were all

green. Second time around, we know how it's going to go. That break [after the first two rotations], it certainly ratchets up the pressure and the excitement, so I think that's great sport," said Ward. "I thought Ilex felt great yesterday; I thought he felt brilliant. I was in a situation to just protect [against] a bad day and make sure we qualified. But I knew he was in for a good chance today. I believed in him, and my team put me in a great position to try to deliver in a moment, and everybody behind me made my job a little bit easier.

Both Kraut and Cook moved forward to contest the Individual Final, hosted later in the week and concluding equestrian competition at Paris 2024, with Kraut guiding Baloutinue to an individual eighth place finish and Cook and Caracole de la Roque finishing in sixteenth overall in their Olympic debut.

With excitement already building for the LA28 Olympic Games on home soil, fans of U.S. jumping have a lot to look forward to as the team works toward taking the step to the top of the next Olympic podium.

U.S. PARALYMPIC DRESSAGE TEAM STRIKES GOLD IN PARIS

In a landmark result, the U.S. Paralympic dressage team stamped their place in the history books by earning the gold medal at the conclusion of team competition at the 2024 Paralympic Games in Paris, France. This marked the first-ever team gold for the U.S. Para Dressage Team at a Paralympic Games and the second consecutive Paralympic team medal following its team bronze at the 2020 Paralympic Games in Tokyo, Japan.

Without a doubt, competing at the highest levels of equestrian sport requires a village. This pinnacle achievement was a feat of hard work and teamwork that lead to the transformation of the U.S. para dressage program over several years. US Equestrian (USEF) High Performance Para Dressage Director Laureen Johnson has meticulously planned and collaborated with coaches and our U.S. Para Dressage Chef

d'Equipe Michel Assouline to bolster the horse and athlete pipelines and build a clear development pathway for aspiring elite riders. Athletes, horse owners, and athletes' personal coaches and grooms have worked in lock step to ensure both human and equine athletes remain in peak condition. Additionally, a critical component to the program's evolution has been the United States Equestrian Team (USET)



Foundation. As the philanthropic partner of USEF, the USET Foundation helps fund U.S. teams and programs, as well as development pathways, through charitable gifts and donations by providing grants to USEF annually.

“This is the completion of a long-time, well-planned dream, going back to the 2018 FEI World Equestrian Games in Tryon, where we started to actually make changes. Back in Tokyo, when we got the team bronze medal, I had a clear plan and strategy in place to get that medal, and I knew that it had to be gold in Paris for us,” said Chef d’Equipe Michel Assouline.

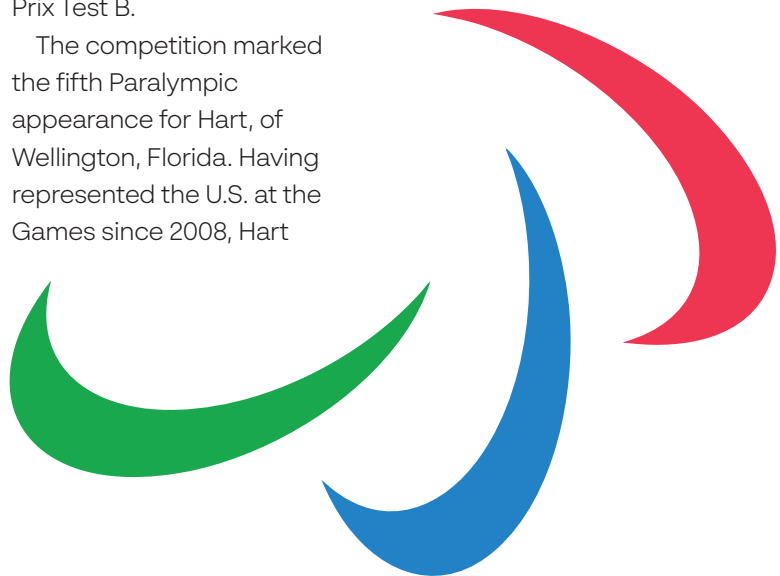
“It took an additional three years of very hard work of planning, logistics, and competition strategies, both in Europe and in the U.S., [to ensure we had] the horsepower and the coaching necessary. The whole program had to really be revamped to get to that point. It’s a funny thing to think that this is the result I expected, but you never want to talk about it openly before it happens. But, it’s what I had in mind, and here we are. It feels like such an amazing accomplishment for everyone who has been involved with this program over the years.”

The three U.S. Paralympic

dressage team athletes laid down impressive scores to top the silver-medal-winning team from The Netherlands. Roxanne Trunnell and Karin Flint’s Fan Tastico H scored a 77.000%, Fiona Howard and Diamond Dunes owned by Dressage Family LLC and Hof Kasselmann scored a stellar personal best of 80.000%, and Rebecca Hart with Rowan O’Riley’s Floratina scored a 78.567% for a cumulative score of 235.567% — the highest Paralympic team score ever recorded.

Rebecca Hart and Floratina (Grade III), Fiona Howard and Diamond Dunes (Grade II), and Roxanne Trunnell and Fan Tastico H (Grade I) each produced top performances scoring 77% or higher in the FEI Grand Prix Test B.

The competition marked the fifth Paralympic appearance for Hart, of Wellington, Florida. Having represented the U.S. at the Games since 2008, Hart

acknowledged the time and determination it took to finally land a team gold medal. "It feels surreal. It was the culmination of years and years and years of work, and I am so wildly proud of all these girls because it's been a group effort to get this done," said Hart. "It wouldn't have happened without each one of us putting our best foot forward. I really hope that this success and these medals bring recognition for para equestrian and demonstrate the equality of the multiple disciplines within our federations. [I also want people to recognize] that we are valuable, and we can deliver when we need to."

Howard, of Boston, Massachusetts, made her

Paralympic debut and scored over 80% twice in her three Paralympic tests aboard Diamond Dunes. "As soon as we started the first trot — even just around the ring — I thought, 'He feels really good.' I went in there, and I remembered my team said to trust him," she explained. "What a feeling when you can just trust your horse, and he kept giving and giving. At the end, my muscles were really tired, and I was thinking, 'Keep going, buddy!' and he was like, 'I've got you.' He's incredible."

Trunnell, of Royal Palm Beach, FL, who recently partnered with Fan Tastico H in early 2024, expressed gratitude for Assouline's coaching that

prepared the combination for the greatest international stage. "I really concentrated on [Fan Tastico H] marching," said Trunnell. "He's so cool at only seven years of age; it's just going to get better and better. I think this success is all thanks to Michel [Assouline]. He got us in shape. He's very strict. I think all his experience has helped us."

U.S. Paralympic dressage athletes also captured several individual medals in their respective grades. On the first day of Paralympic dressage competition, Rebecca Hart aboard Floratina scored 77.900% in Grade III to earn gold, Fiona Howard with Diamond Dunes scored 76.931% in Grade II to take gold, while

Roxanne Trunnell and Fan Tastico H scored 78.000% to finish with individual silver in Grade I.

The next day, Paralympian Kate Shoemaker and Vianne owned by NorCordia USA finished fifth out of 15 international combinations in the competitive Grade IV FEI Grand Prix Test A with a score of 72.222%.

On the final day of

competition, the U.S. Paralympic dressage athletes captured three more individual medals in their respective grades in the freestyle competition.

Kate Shoemaker and Vianne earned their first individual medal of the 2024 Paralympic Games taking bronze in the Grade IV FEI Grand Prix Freestyle with a personal-best score of 80.170%.

Fiona Howard and Diamond Dunes secured their third consecutive gold medal of the 2024 Paralympic Games in the Grade II FEI Grand Prix Freestyle with a personal-best score of 81.994%

Rebecca Hart and Floratina concluded competition at the 2024 Paralympic Games earning an incredible personal-best score of 83.534% to stand atop the podium in the Grade III FEI Grand Prix Freestyle.

Roxanne Trunnell and Fan Tastico H also completed the Grade I FEI Grand Prix Freestyle with a fifth-place finish in a competitive field.

Shoemaker, of Wellington, FL, made her international debut with Vianne in February 2024 in Doha, Qatar, where they earned three first-place finishes in Grade IV competition. "After my first show with Vianne in Doha, I knew that it our partnership was so incredibly special," shared Shoemaker. "She just kept proving that to me show after show, so it was a clear decision to bring her to Paris."

Q *What does a typical day at the Double H Farm look like?*

HOPE RESTORED

for the last truly wild horses

Przewalski’s horse, the world’s last truly wild horse, has had a turbulent history. They once freely roamed the steppes of Central Asia, but, by the 1960s, decades of hunting, trapping, intensive farming and competition for grazing had driven them to extinction in the wild. But last year saw the return of this magnificent horse to the vast landscapes of Kazakhstan, after over a century. It was the result of a unique partnership - the

Altyn Dala Conservation Initiative – which brings together local and global expertise, including the world’s oldest nature conservation charity Fauna & Flora, national government and local community work.

There is nowhere on Earth like the Kazakh steppe in Central Asia. This is the largest expanse of semi-desert grassland in the world, a true wilderness. This is the habitat to which Przewalski’s horse was recently returned.

Seven horses – a stallion and six mares – were transported on a 30-hour flight from Berlin and Prague Zoos to Kazakhstan, where they were reintroduced to their native habitat. The initial seven horses are settling into their new home well.

Over the next five years, the Altyn Dala Conservation Initiative and Prague Zoo plan to transport around 40 horses to central Kazakhstan to form the nucleus of a new breeding population.

Re-establishing a population of Przewalski's horse in Kazakhstan will not only help to boost their dwindling numbers in the wild, but also help benefit all the species that live on the steppe. Their dung enhances soil fertilization, boosts insect numbers and helps disperse the seeds of plants. They provide services for smaller wildlife in the landscape by facilitating access to water through their digging in dry riverbeds and lakes, and by exposing fodder hidden under thick snow cover in winter.

The partnership behind this amazing project is crucial to its success. The Altyn Dala Conservation Initiative is spearheaded by Fauna & Flora's in-country partner, the Association for the Conservation of Biodiversity of Kazakhstan, working in partnership with the Kazakh government's Committee for Forestry and Wildlife, Frankfurt Zoological Society and RSPB. This coalition have worked closely with Prague Zoo, Nuremberg Zoo, Tierpark Berlin, and Hortobagy National Park to make the reintroduction of this

incredible horse a reality. In 2024 The Altyn Dala Conservation Initiative was named a finalist for the prestigious Earthshot Prize, set up by HRH Prince William, highlighting its vital work in protecting and restoring nature.

It is an approach typical of Fauna & Flora which is a global conservation charity that protects the diversity of life on Earth, for the survival of the planet and its people, working closely with local conservation partners in well over 40 countries to save nature, together.

The charity always commits for the long term and so Fauna & Flora plans to continue supporting this groundbreaking reintroduction initiative, drawing on our long history of bringing threatened species back from the brink – from the Arabian oryx to the Antigua racer snake.

We have been using the collective knowledge and experience of our people and our partners to protect nature across the globe for more than 120 years. Worldwide, we are helping to protect and restore over 55 million hectares of crucial habitat, including forests, peatlands, grasslands, seagrass meadows and the ocean. means acetaminophen can lead to severe injury or death.

- **Only 25% of us read and follow medication safety warnings**, putting 75% of us at risk for injury or death if medication is taken incorrectly or misused.
- Some are more vulnerable than others: young adults, the elderly, young children, those with dental pain that persists and those with limited access to medical care.
- Acetaminophen poisoning creeps up on you over a period of time but can also happen quite suddenly so be mindful not to overuse it.
 - **Don't Double Dose:** Never use more than one medication at a time with acetaminophen. For example Tylenol and Nyquil, or Nyquil and Midol. Acetaminophen is contained in more

600 medications.

- **Never drink and take acetaminophen:** Many young adults and college students report taking Tylenol before they go out for a night of drinking. They are immediately putting their liver into double jeopardy due to the way the liver processes alcohol and acetaminophen.
- **Follow the package warnings:** for example, acetaminophen is not intended for chronic pain, should not be given for more than three days for fever and can also be a problem if not eating due to illness.
- **Always consult a doctor before using any medication**, even over-the-counter medication. This pertains to you and those you assist with medical care.
- Look for more natural ways to mitigate and manage pain.
- Always keep track of medication administration, acetaminophen has a small margin of error in dosing and little ones are especially at risk when unwell as parents often reach for pain and fever relief. Access *a free medication*

- Be mindful that all medications can be poisonous, so keep them up and out of the reach of children. This includes brightly colored liquid acetaminophen which children can be drawn to.

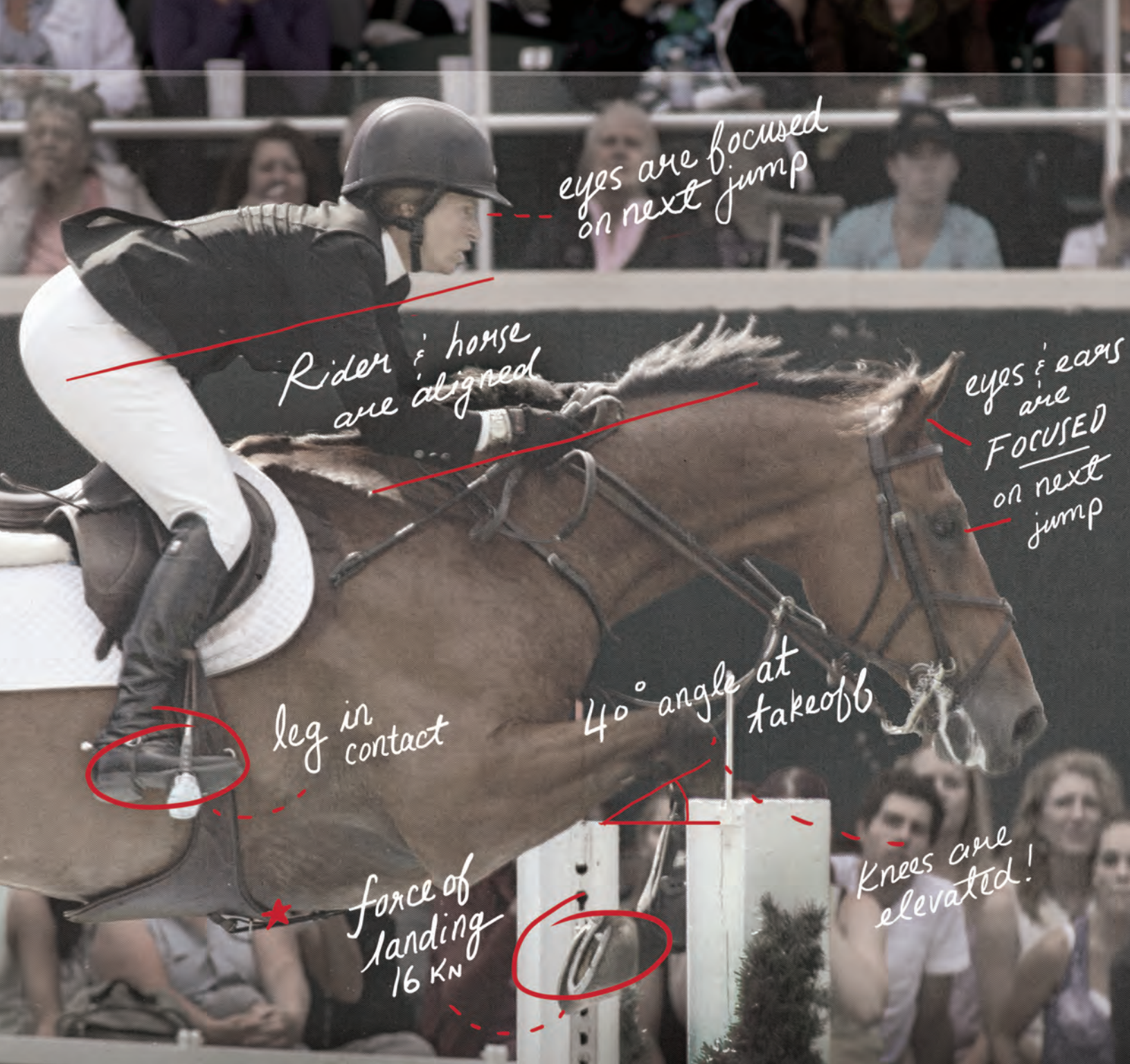

THE SPECTATOR'S GUIDE to Equestrian Competition



Show Jumping

Jumping is the best known and is also one of the three Olympic equestrian sports, along with Dressage and Eventing. The Olympic sport of Grand Prix show jumping is the highest and most challenging level of jumping competition. As in all equestrian sports, men and women compete as equals over a set course of obstacles that can be as tall as 1.60 meters (5.25 feet) in height. They must clear all the fences without knocking down a rail and within the time allowed to return for the second round, also known as the "jump-off," and be the fastest with the least faults to win.

Guide to Show Jumping Scoring

Penalties in show jumping competitions are referred to as "faults." Knocking down a rail or a pole on a jump is 4 faults, as is putting a foot in the water jump or the first refusal. In all jumper classes, falls and going off-course result in elimination, as does a second refusal.

Show Jumping Faults & Penalties

Knocking over a jump:	4 faults
Refusing a jump:	4 faults
Two refusals:	Eliminated
Rider falls off:	Eliminated
Over the time allowed:	1 fault for every second or portion thereof over the time allowed

Hunters

Hunt seat competitions are based upon elegant traditions arising from the foxhunt. Hunters differ from jumpers because they are judged on the style, movement, and technical proficiency of the horse and rider within the constraints of the set course design. Hunters should display jumping ability, manners, style, an even pace and quality.

Equitation

Equitation competition is offered for junior and amateur riders and is judged based on style and form of the rider. Horses are not judged in this discipline, but successful riders will ensure that their horses are well-behaved. Riders can be judged over fences or on the flat.



FEI

Fédération Equestre Internationale is based in Lausanne, Switzerland and is the governing body for all Olympic equestrian disciplines.

Concours de Saut International – CSI

The ranking system for show jumping CSI is broken down into a starring system, the higher the prize money the higher of stars: e.g., CSI 5* prize money is over \$500,000. CSI-W is a show jumping world cup competition.

GROOMS:

Recognizing and Creating Social Development

Though only two figures appear together in the competition arena, the athletic endeavors of our equestrian heroes are the result of the efforts of the vets, farriers, trainers and especially the grooms who work so closely with horses and riders on a daily basis.

Equestrianism is a team sport at its heart – and for far too long the grooms' role in that team was widely underestimated.

The groom is not 'just' a groom. Their first role is to know their horses inside and out and to care for their health and happiness. But they are also logistics managers, drivers, amateur sports psychologists, assistant trainers... the list continues.

For grooms, the priority is always their horses' welfare – and often their riders' too. They work tirelessly to ensure their athletes are supported to be successful in competition; and to ensure their horses

are loved and cared for whatever the outcome.

It is the grooms who are awake first in the morning, and who work late into the night, who carry their riders' hopes and fears alongside their own, and often put their own interests to one side.

ever receive, if not more.”

Public recognition like this is becoming more common, not only from riders, but from shows, where grooms are receiving generous monetary prizes, such as at Wellington International where the Grand Prix winning groom each week receives a \$500 prize, sponsored by Double H Farm.

Unfortunately, it is not yet the norm for grooms to be confident of a positive working environment; there are still many stories of poor employment practices and substandard working conditions, which contributes to a reported rise in grooms leaving the horse industry.

Creating Widespread Change

In 2022 the FEI supported the founding of the International Grooms Association (IGA) – an historic moment, as for the first time grooms were given a formal voice to be heard at the highest levels of horse sport.

The IGA works in collaboration with the FEI and several shows, including Wellington International, to shine a light on the role of the grooms, and to bring

positive development where it is needed.

This year, the IGA has strengthened the existing Board further, welcoming John Madden as Chair, to help guide this mission.

On his appointment, John said “I started in this industry as a groom. I loved the horses and I loved the challenge of our sport, which led me to build my whole future and business around them both.

While mental health issues are common in all walks of life, one group that is often overlooked are athletes, especially those in the equestrian community. Recent studies have highlighted the staggering prevalence of mental health issues across the general population, but athletes, especially those at a competitive level, face unique stressors that can amplify these challenges. The pressures of competition, high expectations, and the demanding nature for equestrians can have significant mental health impacts, yet they are too often brushed aside. It is important that we take the time to not only raise awareness but also to actively support one another by checking in and seeking the help we need.

Equestrians, who work closely with horses and are required to maintain intense focus while managing high-risk situations, are especially vulnerable to these pressures. Riders, trainers, grooms, and stable staff often juggle multiple roles, and the physical and mental demands can be overwhelming.

According to the *National Institute of Mental Health (NIMH)*, approximately 1 in 5 adults

in the United States experience a mental health disorder each year, with anxiety, depression, and attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) being among the most common.

Depression affects roughly 7.8% of the adult U.S. population, but athletes have been shown to experience depression at rates between 10% to 30%.

Anxiety disorders affect about 18% of adults in the general population. Studies suggest that up

to 34% of elite athletes experience anxiety symptoms severe enough to impact performance. ADHD is also prevalent in the U.S., affecting about 4.4% of adults and 5.8% of children.

One of the most important steps in maintaining mental wellness is initiating an open dialogue about your mental health with your primary care physician or mental health professional. Too often, athletes, including those in the equestrian world, do

not address their mental health concerns due to the stigma that surrounds seeking help, or the fear of appearing “weak” in a highly competitive environment. However, early intervention can make a significant difference in preventing a mild condition from becoming a more serious issue.

Primary care physicians are an excellent first point of contact when it comes to mental health. They can identify early symptoms
